Morrisville State Mustangs

Morrisville State College, a residential college located approximately 30 miles between the cities of Syracuse and Utica in Central New York, offers the total college experience. The college allows students to experience the availability of a balance of activities both in and out of the classroom. The athletic program at Morrisville State administers 15 intercollegiate athletic teams and a full schedule of intramural athletic opportunities.

Our athletes have contributed to our long-standing success as an institution and have brought home a number of regional and national titles. Many of the college's athletes have been named All-Americans.

At Morrisville State College, athletes will find outstanding facilities and equipment. A dedicated staff of coaches and trainers act as mentors. The college also offers free tutoring for all students.

The strength of the college's athletic program and its previous success in NJCAA competition has laid a foundation for a smooth transition to the NCAA.

Women's Field Hockey

In 2009, Morrisville State College became an active Division III member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA).

Morrisville State is an associate member with the State University of New York Athletic Conference (SUNYAC) playing a full conference schedule against teams from SUNY Cortland, SUNY Brockport, New Paltz, Geneseo, Oswego, and Oneonta.

While the championships won will always be part of the fabric of Morrisville's athletic heritage, the Mustangs began forging a new tradition as a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA).

The women's field hockey team has a long and successful athletic history at Morrisville. The team has won two New York State Junior College Championships and has produced three NJCAA All-Americans, several all-State selections and in 2003, six NJCAA academic all-Region selections.

After a twenty-year absence, the field hockey program was restored in 1999 and has compiled an overall record of 43 wins, 49 losses and two ties in eight years. The program recorded two back-to-back record breaking seasons, compiling a 17-2-1 overall record and setting new scoring records for Morrisville State College. Morrisville finished the 2004 season with a 10-1-1 overall record, including setting 15 new school records.

In their first season as a member of the SUNYAC, Morrisville State finished the season ranked fourth in the conference, and has posted a fifth and sixth place ranking. Several have earned all-conference honors, and have been named to NFHCA All-Region and ECAC All-Star Teams.

Coaching Staff

Rebecca Osier joins the Mustang athletics staff in 2011 as the head coach of the field hockey program and assistant director of the fitness center.

Osier comes to Morrisville State from Hamilton College, where she has served as an assistant athletic trainer and assistant coach to the field hockey program for the past four seasons. In her time at Hamilton, she helped to organize and carry out daily practice and game strategies, as the team made a program first appearance in the NCAA tournament in 2009.

Joining Hamilton on the Victory Sports Tour, Osier attended private clinics with members of the Argentine Men's and Women's National Teams and national affiliated Argentine coaching staff, while assisting the Hamilton squad against club and university teams in Argentina.

Also a certified athletic trainer, Osier was responsible for providing athletic training coverage to the field hockey, women's basketball, women's ice hockey and women's lacrosse programs as well as others, also working with the 2008 NCAA Division III National Champion Women's Lacrosse team.

Osier spent the spring 2010 working with the field hockey program at Morrisville State, serving as a volunteer assistant coach. In her time with the Mustangs, she taught both technique and skills needed to be successful on the field and assisted with organizing and carrying out practice strategies.

Osier enjoyed tremendous success in her career as a student-athlete at SUNY Cortland. In four years, she tallied 80 points, and assisted the nationally ranked Red Dragons to the NCAA Tournament each season, three quarterfinal appearances and a NCAA National Semifinal appearance in 2003.

She first garnered post-season recognition as a sophomore, taking home first team All-SUNYAC honors, second team All-Region honors, and

third team All-State honors. As a junior, Osier was named to the All-SUNYAC second team, first team All-Region and All-State, and posted second team All-America honors following a 14 goal, four assist performance. In that same season, she posted six game winners and was tied for the team lead in goals. Osier also participated in the England Field Hockey Tour, where she trained and played against club teams at the Crystal Palace National Sports Training Center.

Osier completed her career with a 16 goal, four assist senior season, posting five game winners, as she collected second team All-SUNYAC honors, first team All-New York State (NYSWCAA) honors, and first team NFHCA All-North Atlantic Region honors. At the conclusion of the season, she was selected to participate in the North/South Senior All-Star Game.

In the time since her playing career, Osier has been actively involved with several camps and clinics throughout New York, serving as a camp counselor and clinician for the Hamilton College Field Hockey Camp and the SUNY Cortland Field Hockey Sports Camp.

Osier earned her bachelor's degree in athletic training and exercise science: kinesiology from Cortland in 2007.

Athletic Facilities

Morrisville State College offers a dynamic intercollegiate and intramural athletics program. With 15 different teams to choose from, students have variety when it comes to playing a sport, either competitively or just for fun.

A new multipurpose stadium has enhanced the intercollegiate athletic program at MSC, and is also used for intramural events. It is an immense resource for the community and area high school athletic teams looking for a synthetic turf facility, as Morrisville State College will host many post-season events at the high school and collegiate levels.



Morrisville State College has excellent on-campus athletic facilities for all students, including an indoor recreation center, two gymnasiums, twin ice rinks, fitness center, tennis courts, basketball courts and several athletic fields.

John W. Stewart Center for Student Activities (STUAC)

STUAC houses the main gymnasium (a second gymnasium is housed in Hamilton Hall), a state-of-the-art fitness center, coaching offices, training room and additional men's and women's locker rooms.

Gymnasium

Morrisville has two gymnasiums. Varsity athletic contests are scheduled in the STUAC gymnasium while intramural and recreational hours are held in the Hamilton Hall gymnasium and the Recreation Center.

Fitness Center

Located on the lower level of STUAC, the fitness center currently features a variety of weight training machines, treadmills, steppers, elliptical trainers and other aerobic machines and a hardwood aerobics room.

Outdoor Facilities

The college's outdoor facilities include a synthetic 400-meter track, two outdoor tennis courts, two outdoor basketball courts, as well as athletic fields for football, field hockey, soccer, lacrosse and softball.

IcePlex

The Morrisville State College IcePlex houses two regulation-sized rinks and serves as home ice for the men's ice hockey team. Several community organizations also call the IcePlex home. Within the twin-rink complex are classrooms that provide hands-on training, a first-aid room, 11 locker rooms, offices, a game room, pizza and sub shop, and a pro shop. The IcePlex hosts hockey tournaments and hockey camps as well as ice skating shows by the IcePlex Figure Skating Club.

Recreation Center

The college's recreation center brings an artificial-surfaced field house to the campus and serves as an invaluable resource for all the college's field-based teams for the playing season. Featuring an athletic training room, a laundry and equipment room, wrestling room, locker rooms for men and women, and several athletic department staff and support offices, the recreation center also provides an indoor 200-meter track.

Athletic Training Room

Full-time athletic trainers are available to athletes for care and prevention of athletic injuries. The athletic training room in the recreation center serves athletes' daily needs as well as rehabilitative needs following injury, and is equipped with a variety of whirlpools and strength equipment and machines. An orthopedic doctor reports to campus once a week to evaluate athletes' injuries.
