Morrisville State College, located in Central New York, offers bachelor degrees and a wide variety of associate degrees and options. Considered to be one of the most technologically advanced colleges in the nation for its ThinkPad University program and wireless technology initiative, the college was the first in the nation to comprehensively replace telephones in residence halls with individual cellular phones for students. Morrisville State College was also chosen as one of the top five colleges in the nation for campus activities by Campus Activities magazine. The Morrisville State College Norwich Campus offers programs in business, technologies, liberal arts/education transfer, and nursing to Chenango County area residents and employers.

To be eligible for NCAA competition, all student-athletes must be enrolled in a program leading to a baccalaureate degree and have taken the SAT exam.

Morrisville State Mustangs

Morrisville State College, a residential college located approximately 30 miles between the cities of Syracuse and Utica in Central New York, offers the total college experience. The college allows students to experience the availability of a balance of activities both in and out of the classroom. The athletic program at Morrisville State administers 16 intercollegiate athletic teams and a full schedule of intramural athletic opportunities.

Our athletes have contributed to our long-standing success as an institution and have brought home a number of regional and national titles. Many of the college's athletes have been named All-Americans.

At Morrisville State College, athletes will find outstanding facilities and equipment. A dedicated staff of coaches and trainers act as mentors. The college also offers free tutoring for all students.

In 2009, Morrisville State College became an active Division III member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA).

Morrisville State College belongs to the New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) facing opponents such as SUNY Cortland, Montclair State University, The College of New Jersey, Rowan University, William Paterson College, SUNY Brockport, Buffalo State College, Kean University, and Western Connecticut State University.

Mustang Football

In its nine seasons as a member of the NJCAA, the football team won three Northeast Football Conference Championships, two Region III Championships and produced several all-conference selections and NJCAA All-Americans. Five were named conference Players-of-the-Year.

Many players under Dow continued their collegiate experience into NCAA Division I programs and the professional level. Morrisville's 2001 NFC Defensive Player of the Year and NJCAA All-American linebacker, Alex Lewis, was the first Mustang under Dow to be drafted into the NFL in 2004, picked by the Detroit Lions in the fifth round.

While the championships won will always be part of the fabric of Morrisville's athletic heritage, the Mustangs are anxious to begin forging a new tradition as a member of the NCAA.

Morrisville State begins its second season as a member of the New Jersey Athletic Conference in the fall of 2009.

In its first season of NJAC competition, Morrisville State was 1-9 overall on the season, 0-9 in conference action. Despite the record, three earned All-Conference honors, and several, player of the week honors, with many notable record breaking performances throughout the season.

Head Coach

Terry Dow completed his 13th season as head coach of the football program at Morrisville State College in 2009.

In 12 seasons with the Mustangs, Dow has compiled an overall record of 63 wins and 59 losses, claiming three National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Northeast Football Conference championships and two Region III championships.

In 2002, Dow coached the Mustangs to a 9-2 overall record, the most wins at Morrisville State, and an undefeated conference record of 5-0, claiming the school's second conference championship in three seasons. That same year, Morrisville State took the Region III championship title and Dow was named the Northeast Football Conference Coach of the Year.

Dow has coached 83 NFC all-Conference selections, six players of the

year and 11 NJCAA All-America team selections since the programs reinstatement in 1997, including NFC Defensive Player of the Year and outside linebackers coach, Chad Rowe. For five straight seasons (2001-2005), the Northeast Football Conference named one of Dow's student-athletes as the offensive or defensive player of the year.

A 1990 graduate of Ithaca College with a bachelor of science degree in physical education, Dow spent two seasons as a player under legendary head coach Jim Butterfield, and remained at Ithaca for three additional seasons as assistant coach for the offensive and defensive lines.

In 1991, Dow joined the football coaching staff at Colgate University as coach of the tight ends for the Raiders before accepting a coaching position at Monmouth University in New Jersey.

Named the offensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator in 1993 at Monmouth, a Division I-AA football program, Dow spent four seasons gaining vast knowledge and experience in the collegiate ranks.

For six years, Dow served as president of the NFC Coaches' Association and was the District I representative to the NJCAA for football. He is a member of the American Football Coaches' Association and was instrumental in Morrisville State College becoming a member institute of the New York State High School Coaches Football Association.

Aside from his duties as head coach of the football program, Dow also serves as the compliance director for men's athletics at Morrisville State.

About Morrisville State

Students at Morrisville State College choose from bachelor and associate degrees in more than 70 majors and options in the Schools of Agriculture and Natural Resources, Business, Liberal Arts and Science and Technology. Approximately 50 degree programs are ThinkPad University curricula where the use of laptop computers is fully integrated into academic life.

With 3,338 students, Morrisville offers an environment which encourages class participation and exploration and provides students with the opportunity to grow intellectually and personally. The student-to-faculty ratio at Morrisville is low, providing students with an opportune learning environment. Morrisville State College's academic programs include general education electives as well as courses in students' field of concentration.

Admission

Morrisville State College accepts students on a rolling admission basis. Requirements for admission to academic programs vary. SAT and ACT exams are required for students applying to bachelor degree programs. On-campus interviews are recommended.

Financial Aid

Morrisville State awards financial aid on the basis of need. More than 85 percent of the student body receives financial aid in the form of scholarships, grants, loans or an on-campus job. Many students participate in state and federal programs such as Pell and TAP grants.

Residential Life

Eleven residence halls offer a variety of living arrangements for students and a variety of dining facilities provide different meal options. Residence halls provide an opportunity for autonomy and affiliation in a supportive environment and serve as centers for organized social, cultural and educational activities.

Each residence hall offers study and recreational lounges, laundry facilities, wired and wireless computer access and a variety of vending machines. Each room is furnished with desks and chairs, beds, dressers, floor lamps and cable hookup.

There is always something to do on campus with more than 40 clubs and organizations, campus social activities as well as dramatic and musical productions.

Athletic Facilities

Morrisville State College has a variety of excellent athletic facilities designed to cultivate physical achievement and well-being, both among intercollegiate athletes and the campus community.

The Morrisville State College IcePlex houses two regulation-sized rinks and serves as home ice for the men's hockey team. Several community organizations also call the IcePlex home. Within the twin-rink ice complex are classrooms that provide hands-on training, a first-aid room, 11 locker rooms, offices, a game room, pizza and sub shop and a pro shop.

The college's outdoor facilities include a synthetic 400-meter track, six outdoor tennis courts, and athletic fields for football, field hockey, soccer, softball and lacrosse.



Full-time athletic trainers are available to athletes for care and prevention of athletic injuries. An orthopedic doctor reports to campus once a week to evaluate athletes' injuries. The trainer is associated with the Hamilton Orthopaedic Office located 10 minutes from Morrisville State College.

A \$2 million renovation and expansion of the college's Recreation Center was completed in January 2007, brought an artificial surfaced field house to campus. The renovated Recreation Center also features a new athletic training room, which will have the ability to serve athletes' daily needs as well as rehabilitative needs following injury. It is equipped with a variety of whirlpools and strength equipment and machines. The facility also contains a new laundry and equipment room, wrestling room, locker rooms for men and women and several Athletic Department staff/support offices. The Recreation Center also provides an indoor 200m track.



Future plans are to renovate and expand the college's fitness and wellness center located in the STUAC. The fitness center currently features a variety of weight training machines, treadmills, steppers, elliptical trainers and other aerobic machines. The current fitness center also contains a hardwood aerobics room. STUAC houses the main gymnasium (seated capacity 1,200), an auxiliary equipment/laundry room, Athletic Department



staff offices, and additional men's and women's locker rooms.
