Morrisville State College, located in Central New York, offers bachelor degrees and a wide variety of associate degrees and options. Considered to be one of the most technologically advanced colleges in the nation for its ThinkPad University program and wireless technology initiative, the college was the first in the nation to comprehensively replace telephones in residence halls with individual cellular phones for students. Morrisville State College was also chosen as one of the top five colleges in the nation for campus activities by *Campus Activities* magazine. The Morrisville State College Norwich Campus offers programs in business, technologies, liberal arts/education transfer, and nursing to Chenango County area residents and employers.

To be eligible for NCAA competition, all student-athletes must be enrolled in a program leading to a baccalaureate degree and have taken the SAT exam.

Morrisville State College, a residential college located approximately 30 miles between the cities of Syracuse and Utica in Central New York, offers the total college experience. The college allows students to experience the availability of a balance of activities both in and out of the classroom. The athletic program at Morrisville State administers 16 intercollegiate athletic teams and a full schedule of intramural athletic opportunities.

Our athletes have contributed to our long-standing success as an institution and have brought home a number of regional and national titles. Many of the college's athletes have been named All-Americans.

At Morrisville State College, athletes will find outstanding facilities and equipment. A dedicated staff of coaches and trainers act as mentors. The college also offers free tutoring for all students.

Women's Volleyball

In 2009, Morrisville State College became an active Division III member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA).

Morrisville State College began membership with the North Eastern Athletic Conference (NEAC) in 2009. Current conference members include Cazenovia College, Gallaudet University, Keuka College, Penn State - Abington, Penn State - Berks, Penn State - Harrisburg, SUNY Cobleskill, SUNY Institute of Technology, College of St. Elizabeth, Wilson and Wells College.

While the championships won will always be part of the fabric of Morrisville's athletic heritage, the Mustangs are anxious to begin forging a new tradition as a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA).

In 2008, the women's team had two named to the All-SUNYAC Conference teams and three were named to the SUNYAC All-Academic team.

The women's volleyball team has produced several Mountain Valley All-Conference selections, three NJCAA Academic All-Region selections and one NJCAA Academic All-American. Many players, throughout the season, have ranked competitively in Region III in scoring, hitting as well as defensive and attack statistics.

Morrisville volleyball played a 14 game schedule and competed in approximately six tournaments in its inaugural NCAA season. The combination of the incoming class and veteran players gives Morrisville State College an edge when competing against outstanding competition in the fall.

Head Coach

Brian Ellithorpe enters his fourth season as the head coach of the volleyball program at Morrisville State in the fall 2010.

In three seasons at the helm of the program, Ellithorpe has tallied 28 wins and 61 losses and has coached several all-tournament team selections as well as two All-SUNYAC team selections and all-NEAC team selections.

Ellithorpe comes to Morrisville from Cazenovia High School where he served as the head coach of the elite varsity program for 11 seasons. In 2006 he also served as the assistant volleyball coach at Cazenovia College.

While at Cazenovia, Ellithorpe served as the high school volleyball camp director and as a coach at the Baldwinsville Summer Volleyball camps for several years. In 2000, he was the assistant coach for the Open Women's Volleyball team for the Empire State Games.

Aside from coaching volleyball at Cazenovia High, Ellithorpe also teaches physical education. He has served as the varsity boys cross-country coach and girl's varsity golf coach at Cazenovia since 1998. Ellithorpe graduated from SUNY Cortland with a master's degree in physical education in 1999.

Assistant Coach

Jeremy Cook joined the Morrisville State College volleyball staff in the fall of 2006 as assistant coach of the women's program.

Instrumental in creating player workouts and practices, Cook also assists with the recruiting of prospective student-athletes, as well as current and prospective player development. He also aids in developing scouting reports on opponents.

Prior to Morrisville, Cook served in various levels of coaching, including the assistant boys varsity basketball coach at Fayetteville-Manlius and Marcellus High Schools. Currently he is the JV Girls Volleyball Coach and the Girls Varsity Volleyball Assistant Coach for Homer High School. Cook is the founder and club director for the Homer Area Volleyball Club, which is in its first season in 2009-10. He also is the head coach of the Club Team "Homer Smash" with the U14 Girls.

Cook also works and directs numerous volleyball camps/clinics in the Central New York area including camps at Homer and Cazenovia High Schools.

A 2007 graduate of SUNY Cortland with a masters in science health education, Cook currently serves as the physical education instructor at Homer Junior High School.

About Morrisville State

Students at Morrisville State College choose from bachelor and associate degrees in more than 70 majors and options in the Schools of Agriculture and Natural Resources, Business, Liberal Arts and Science and Technology. Approximately 50 degree programs are ThinkPad University curricula where the use of laptop computers is fully integrated into academic life.

With 3,338 students, Morrisville offers an environment which encourages class participation and exploration and provides students with the opportunity to grow intellectually and personally. The student-to-faculty ratio at Morrisville is low, providing students with an opportune learning environment. Morrisville State College's academic programs include general education electives as well as courses in students' field of concentration.

Admission

Morrisville State College accepts students on a rolling admission basis. Requirements for admission to academic programs vary. SAT and ACT exams are required for students applying to bachelor degree programs. On-campus interviews are recommended.

Financial Aid

Morrisville State awards financial aid on the basis of need. More than 85 percent of the student body receives financial aid in the form of scholarships, grants, loans or an on-campus job. Many students participate in state and federal programs such as Pell and TAP grants.

Residential Life

Eleven residence halls offer a variety of living arrangements for students and a variety of dining facilities provide different meal options. Residence halls provide an opportunity for autonomy and affiliation in a supportive environment and serve as centers for organized social, cultural and educational activities.

Each residence hall offers study and recreational lounges, laundry facilities, wired and wireless computer access and a variety of vending machines. Each room is furnished with desks and chairs, beds, dressers, floor lamps and cable hookup.

There is always something to do on campus with more than 40 clubs and organizations, campus social activities as well as dramatic and musical productions.

Athletic Facilities

Morrisville State College has a variety of excellent athletic facilities designed to cultivate physical achievement and well-being, both among intercollegiate athletes and the campus community.

The Morrisville State College IcePlex houses two regulation-sized rinks and serves as home ice for the men's hockey team. Several community organizations also call the IcePlex home. Within the twin-rink ice complex are classrooms that provide hands-on training, a first-aid room, 11 locker rooms, offices, a game room, pizza and sub shop and a pro shop.

Full-time athletic trainers are available to athletes for care and prevention of athletic injuries. An orthopedic doctor reports to campus once a week to evaluate athletes' injuries. The trainer is associated with the Hamilton Orthopaedic Office located 10 minutes from Morrisville State College. In the spring of 2006, ground was broken on a \$2 million renovation and expansion of the college's Recreational Center. This project, complete in January 2007, brought an artificial surfaced field house to campus. The renovated Recreation Center also features a new athletic training room,



which will have the ability to serve athletes' daily needs as well as rehabilitative needs following injury. It is equipped with a variety of whirlpools and strength equipment and machines. The facility also contains a new laundry and equipment room, wrestling room, locker rooms for men and women and several Athletic Department staff/support offices. The Recreation Center also provides an indoor 200m track.

Future plans are to renovate and expand the college's fitness and wellness center located in the STUAC. The fitness center currently features a variety of weight training machines, treadmills, steppers, elliptical trainers and other aerobic machines. The area reserved for these activities will be expanded as part of the



upcoming STUAC renovation. The current fitness center also contains a hardwood aerobics room. STUAC houses the main gymnasium (seated capacity 1,200), an auxiliary equipment/laundry room, Athletic Department staff offices, and additional men's and women's locker rooms. STUAC renovations, complete in the fall of 2006, brought a new food court and lounge to the student center to better serve all students.



A multi-purpose stadium features artificial turf, lights, new scoreboard, locker rooms, press box and stadium seating for 1,500 spectators for field hockey, football, men's and women's soccer, and men's and women's lacrosse.
