Morrisville State College is committed to assisting all members of our community in providing for their own safety and security. By October 1 of each year, Morrisville State College is required to publish and distribute an annual campus security report to all current and prospective students and employees. The annual security compliance document at Morrisville State College is called the Annual Security Report. The report contains information on campus security and personal safety, including crime prevention, NYS University Police law-enforcement authority, crime reporting policies, disciplinary procedures and other important matters about security on campus. It also contains statistics for the three previous calendar years on reported crimes that occurred on campus, in certain off-campus buildings or property owned or controlled by Morrisville State College and on public property within or immediately adjacent to and accessible from the campus. **Environmental Impact Statement**

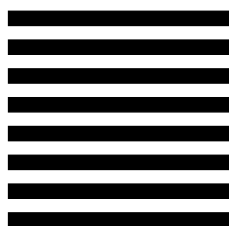

## Academics

Hands-on learning provides students with real-world experience and some are participating in exciting entrepreneurial endeavors like running the college's restaurant, working in a small-scale food processing plant and assisting with annual horse sales.

At the hub of learning are faculty-scholars who bring their expertise into the classroom and help make a difference by encouraging students to explore their varied interests.

A Norwich Campus, located 30 miles southeast of the main campus in Chenango County, offers associate degree programs, academic concentrations and course work that students can apply to other associate or bachelor degree programs at the Morrisville campus

## Technology

Recognized as a national leader in pioneering technology, Morrisville State College boasts some of the most advanced technology. Take a look around campus and see how technology is integrated into all aspects of campus life, from the classroom to the social scene.

The campus is fully wireless—recently implementing the fastest wireless network connection in the world, and students enrolled in IBM ThinkPad programs utilize laptop computers. A Nextel cellular phone and an introductory calling plan are included as a part of their residence hall package.

With all of this technology at their fingertips, students are gaining an edge, graduating with the expertise they need to become leaders in the workforce.

## Facilities

Outstanding academic and recreational facilities, including scientific and technical laboratories, along with aquaculture, dairy and equine science, automotive technology, restaurant management, computer technologies and wood products technology facilities, enhance students' academic and social experiences.

As part of its entrepreneurial endeavors, the college operates a mini dairy processing plant, a horticulture shop, which hosts an annual flower and plant sale, Equine Institute and the Copper Turret, a full-service restaurant in the village of Morrisville.

Students may utilize the college's athletic facilities too, including the fitness center, two gymnasiums, the IcePlex, with twin ice rinks and recreation center. There are also outdoor

athletic facilities including softball, baseball, and soccer fields, as well as both indoor and outdoor fitness tracks.

An on-campus student health center allows students to get basic medical care and advice without leaving campus.

Morrisville students can choose from 12 on-campus residence halls offering a range of lifestyle options, including apartment-style suites, single rooms and split-double rooms. All first-year students are required to live on-campus for their first two semesters. Exceptions to this requirement can be made for students commuting from their permanent address [within a 30-mile radius from the college], and those who are over age 21.
