Code of Ethics

You are bound by the Code of Ethics as set forth in the Public Officers Law. Upon initial employment, you were required to file a statement that you had received, read, and will conform with the provisions of the Code of Ethics.

This required statements informs you that as a public employee you are bound by legal restrictions with respect to certain activities and interests of a private nature. It also constitutes your promise to maintain the highest principles of conduct in the discharge of your responsibilities, acknowledging your obligation to follow a pattern of behavior in your job which will reflect favorably upon you, the State University and the government.

The State Code of Ethics especially requires that as a State employee, you will pursue a course of conduct which will not give the impression that you may be influenced or affected in any way in the proper performance of your duties or that you are likely to engage in acts that violate your trust. For specific restrictions relative to the Code of Ethics, please refer to the provisions of Sections 73 through 78 of the Public Officers Law. Copies may be obtained in the Human Resources Office.
